PROPOSED SENATE BILL REGARDING THE TEXAS LOTTERY

AMENDED

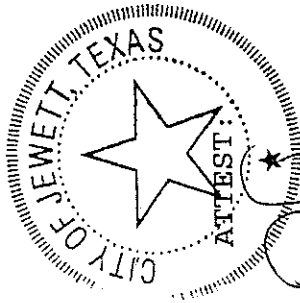
WHEREAS, the Texas Lottery Commission has conducted the Texas Lottery since its implementation in 1992; and


WHEREAS, Senator Tom Haywood has proposed a senate bill to be presented in the 1997 legislative session of the Texas Senate that would require the Texas Lottery Commission to return four cents of every lottery sales dollars to the city where the sales was transacted and one cent to the county where the sales transaction location regardless incorporated or unincorporated areas of the county; and


WHEREAS, the state lottery ticket sales in Leon County during the calendar year 1995 totaled \$4,088,663., and this proposed bill would have returned to the cities and county of Leon County a total of \$204,433.15; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, on October 21, 1996, the City Council of the City of Jewett, adopted an official Resolution approving the acceptance of the proposed senate bill by Senator Tom Haywood returning five cents from every dollar of the Texas state lottery ticket sales returned to the cities and counties.

DONE IN OPEN MEETING, this the 28th day of October, 1996, upon motion by Ald. Evans and seconded by Ald. Wynn and 3 members of the Council being present and voting "aye."
